CAV and CAMWS—Together Again

The Fall 2014 CAV Meeting will be held on Saturday, October 18, in conjunction with the 94th Anniversary Meeting of the Classical Association of the Middle West and South—Southern Section (October 16-18), at the invitation of the University of Mary Washington and the National Latin Exam, in Fredericksburg, Virginia. CAV and CAMWS have held several combined meetings in the past. The Fall 2010 CAV Centennial Meeting was held in association with a meeting of CAMWS—Southern Section in Richmond; and the Spring 2016 CAV Meeting is slated to be held in association with a CAMWS meeting in Williamsburg. These combined meetings offer a great opportunity to meet colleagues from outside Virginia, hear a wider than usual selection of papers, and browse publishers' tables in the book exhibit. Plus, for a cost of \$7.50 teachers can earn 3.3 Continuing Education Units by obtaining a form at registration and returning it before leaving the meeting.

CAMWS includes 32 states and three Canadian provinces. Members of CAMWS who live in the South also receive the benefit—for no additional fee—of membership in the Southern Section. CAMWS is such a large regional organization (35 states and provinces!) that people join and come to its meetings from all over the United States and Canada, even from beyond its official territory. Not a member? You do NOT have to be a member of CAMWS to attend the joint CAV/CAMWS-SS meeting in Fredericksburg this October. You will need to register for the CAMWS meeting (\$20 for a one-day registration—see the CAMWS-SS meeting registration form on page 7), and if you wish to join your CAV colleagues at lunch before the CAV business meeting on October 18th, you will need to register and pay for lunch (\$22.50) using the same CAMWS-SS meeting registration form. Deadline for submission of the form: October 1st. (Note that the CAV Membership Renewal Form is separate from the meeting registration form this year.)

Come to the whole CAMWS-SS meeting, or come for just the usual CAV Saturday meeting, but please come! All paper sessions will be held at the Fredericksburg Hospitality House Hotel and Conference Center, except for those on Friday afternoon, which will be held on the beautiful Fredericksburg campus of the University of Mary Washington. For program, travel, and hotel information for the meeting, see <https://camws.org/node/282>. Deadline for hotel registration at special conference rate: September 25th.

Please join us for the CAV luncheon on Saturday, starting at 11:30 in the Palm Room of the Fredericksburg Hospitality House Hotel and Conference Center. The menu will consist of Pasta Primavera—al dente rigatoni, tossed with broccoli, cauliflower, sweet peppers, and mushrooms, with a light, creamy Alfredo sauce, served hot; garden salad; rolls; "Chef's choice" of dessert; and your choice of freshly brewed coffee, decaf, or iced tea. The luncheon will be followed by the CAV business meeting at 12:30 in the same room.

CAMWS Latin Translation Contest: \$250 Cash Prizes for Students

The Classical Association of the Middle West and South offers \$250 cash prizes, book awards, and letters of commendation to qualifying winners in its School Awards Latin Translation Contest. This year's competition is open to advanced Latin students enrolled in secondary schools, or homeschooled, in the United States or Canada. Their teachers must be a member of CAMWS, or the school must be an institutional member, or the school library must subscribe to *The Classical Journal*. Following the annual alternation of Prose and Poetry, the 2014-2015 one-hour examination will offer Latin Prose as exemplified by Caesar, Cicero et al. Contestants should translate as literally as possible without violating English idiom, and should know relevant vocabulary presented in Colby's *Latin Word Lists* (a copy of which is available upon request with registration). This examination is intended for students who have had at least three years of Latin, but is also open to superior second-year students. The exam must be administered by a school official other than the Latin teacher between December 1 and 12, 2014. Writers of the 10 most outstanding papers will each receive a \$250 cash prize. An additional 20 contestants will receive a book prize. Up to 30 other writers will receive letters of commendation. Winners will be announced in February, 2014. 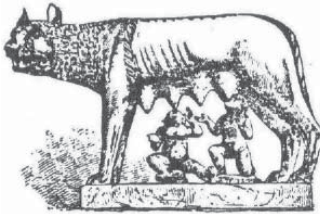
