New CAV Officers Elected



Margaret Hicks will serve as our new CAV president. Mrs. Hicks has taught Latin at L.C. Bird High School in Chesterfield since its opening in 1978. Her club has been actively involved in VJCL and has had a few state officers over the years. She prides herself on having been on TV for using Magna Doodles in the classroom and on having created the VJCL Storytelling Contest. She has also been a charter member of the Central Virginia Latin Teachers Association, has presented on ancient Roman glass at NJCL convention and CAV meetings, and has participated in the University of Maryland's

Summer Stabiae archaeological program in Italy. This past fall she helped organize an exchange program with Latin students and their teacher from Castellammare di Stabia's Pliny the Elder High School, and she is working on the reciprocal visit for next year.

Professor Fred Franko of Hollins University will serve as our new CAV Vice-President. Not a native of Virginia, Professor Franko came to the Commonwealth as an undergraduate at The College of William and Mary, where he studied under J. Ward Jones. After earning his Ph.D. at Columbia University in New York, he returned to teach at Randolph-Macon Woman's College. From there he joined the faculty of Hollins College in 1993, where he has taught Latin, Greek, ancient history, mythology, classics in translation, and even Shakespeare. Professor Franko has taught classes, given lectures, and co-directed plays with the Virginia Governor's Latin Academy since 1993. His main research covers Plautus and Roman comedy, but he has published on such topics as Vergil, Homer, papyrology, and Shakespeare.



Our new CAV Secretary will be Lisa Auanger. Lisa has taught Latin at Kecoughtan High School in Hampton since 2002 and grade 3 - 8 Archaeology for the Center for Gifted Education at William and Mary's Enrichment program since 2005. Last year (2011) she was named Hampton City Schools Teacher of the Year; in 2009 she was the HCS Foreign Language Teacher of the Year. She studied at Southwestern University in Georgetown, TX; the Intercollegiate Center for Classical Studies in Rome; and the University of

Missouri, where she earned her doctorate with a dissertation on representations of women (female figures) in official arts of Ancient Rome in 1997. She participates in the Ancient Coins for Education program, is a team captain for Relay for Life, sponsors a Leo Club (affiliated with Lions Club), and has an active Latin Club that regularly attends JCL.

Lurlene W. Todd Teacher of the Year Award: Howard W. Chang

“I stand in awe of Howard Chang,” begins one letter recommending Mr. Chang for the Lurlene W. Todd Teacher of the Year Award. This year’s recipient has many qualities, including his enthusiasm and ‘tireless dedication, but above all is his willingness to teach all students.

The recipient helps all students love learning Latin, whether its a hesitant student who needs help with memorization or a veteran JCLer who needs help preparing for convention. One reviewer comments on his “new and innovative ideas for getting our already involved students even more involved.” He has gained a reputation or creating catchy songs to help students with memorization of endings and grammar, and he has started an after-school peer-tutoring program. One recommender remarks on the recipient’s willingness to help all students as he “works tirelessly with *Castra Latina*, Flint Hill’s summer Latin camp, a program open to *all* students in Virginia who wish to prepare for state convention competitions.”

Aside from his work with students, the recipient also encourages new teachers, both in the classroom and in getting involved with Latin organizations. He shares selflessly, offering ideas on lesson plans, assignments, and grading. He also reaches out to teachers of other areas in Virginia, encouraging them get involved and to bring their students to certamen competitions and conventions. For new teachers or for those getting involved for the first time, his warmth and knowledge on how to get involved can make all the difference in an otherwise daunting first step.

For encouraging the spread of classics for both students and teachers, it is with great pleasure that I announce the winner of this year’s Lurlene W. Todd TEACHER of the Year Award: Howard Chang. In the words of one reviewer, “it was clear to anyone who paid attention that Howard’s students adored him.”

Angela Lloyd Book Award: Linda Wagstaff

“As a CAV lifetime member, Linda is the epitome of the caring, giving, and devoted teacher that Angela symbolized for so many of us.” Thus begins one recommendation for this year’s recipient of the Angela Lloyd Book Award. This year’s recipient is being honored for

many qualities and accomplishments, but for her service to her students above all.

This recipient’s dedication can be seen in the successful Latin program at Monacan High School, with students there who consistently participate in and perform well on the National Latin Exam, CAV Latin Tournament, and the Medusa Mythology Examination. Her students have also won recognition on numerous essay contests. A colleague recalled how in an essay contest sponsored by the Richmond-Times Dispatch and Randol Macon College the recipient’s “students took six of the ten places in the competition, including FIRST PLACE.” The winner received a free trip to Athens!

The recipient is also renowned remarks for her “tireless energy” in planning and supervising many trips overseas. A colleague recalls a time when the recipient paid full price for her own daughter to attend a trip so that a fellow Latin teacher, who could not afford to go, would receive a free trip. The colleague, impressed by her unselfishness, writes, “she wanted the teacher to experience what she teaches first hand.”

In fact, the recipient travels so often it was on a trip to Italy that she found out that she had won the award. She was actually able to select the books for her award while in Italy!

It is with great pleasure that I announce the winner of this year’s Angela Lloyd Book Award: Ms. Linda Hart Wagstaff. As a colleague writes, “her students would agree that ‘The Wag’ or ‘Mrs. Wag’, as they fondly call her, is very deserving...the students know that Linda will be there for them a 100%+.”

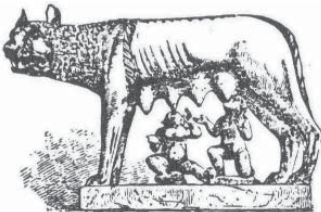
