Virginia Legislature Endorses Biliteracy Seal

This past Spring was a very active one for language department supervisors and language teachers across the Commonwealth both at the college and secondary levels. The Virginia Department of Education was tasked with establishing the criteria for demonstrating competency in a second language. These criteria will be used by districts and schools across the Commonwealth to evaluate students for earning a seal on their high school diplomas that acknowledges the significant achievement of biliteracy in English and another language.

At the Spring CAV meeting, the Executive Committee discussed the criteria for Latin students, and their proposal was approved by the CAV members present at the business meeting. Here are the recommendations that were sent to the Department of Education for final approval:

- AP Latin score of 3 or higher
- IB Latin score of 4 or higher
- SAT II Latin subject test score of 600 or higher
- National Latin Exam level 4 test with achievement at silver medal level or higher, or NLE Level 5-6 test with achievement at *cum laude* level or higher
- Intermediate Mid score on the ALIRA test in Latin

It is important to note that the suggestions and the criteria for the new seal are in the early stages. There will continue to be further dialogue between the Virginia Department of Education and state organization such as the CAV to revise the requirements and clarify issues that arise.

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CAV PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Colleagues,

Two things on my mind.

First, at the CAMWS meeting in Boulder, a colleague from another state who attended our fall CAV meeting (held jointly with CAMWS-SS) confessed to me his envy of the collegiality we enjoy in CAV. Our luncheon—well attended, light-hearted, efficient—showcased our unity and strength as teachers from universities, colleges, high schools, and middle schools broke bread together. Few states can boast such camaraderie. That said, we should not compare ourselves to other states; our comparandum must be ourselves, both formerly and ideally. We cannot grow complacent and leave it to someone else to attend the meeting, or pay the dues, or enter the contest. As Susan Schearer remarked when receiving her Jane Harriman Hall Award for outstanding service to CAV, “it never occurred to me *not* to attend.”

Second, I am grateful to those who are working to ensure that Latin finds an appropriate voice in the formulation of Virginia's Seal of Biliteracy. While Margaret Hicks and Adriene Cunningham have proved instrumental in the program's initial stages, the standards for the seal are not set in stone, and the Commonwealth looks to the membership of CAV to provide guidance. Discussion at the spring meeting raised important and provocative concerns. Please continue the conversation via email, as some of you have; and I hope that we can find time at subsequent CAV meetings to evaluate our satisfaction with the program and make whatever adjustments we deem fit. In the language of the DOE, we are “stakeholders” in this enterprise.

LATN 470 Medieval Latin for Teachers

This online course shows how the Latin language and genres of writing such as legends, biographies, letters, and poetry developed during the period 500-1500 CE, following the fall of Rome in 476 CE. Thus it provides continuity from the study of ancient Roman culture, prose, and poetry, which spread throughout the empire, was preserved in manuscripts and printed books, and developed in new forms. The course includes reading and translation, an introduction to paleography or handwriting styles in manuscripts, and lesson plans for teaching. It is designed especially for students planning to teach or teachers seeking certification credits in Latin.

Objectives:

- 1) Gain understanding of the differences between Classical and Medieval Latin;
- 2) Expand knowledge of genres of writing and their cultures in the Middle Ages;
- 3) Practice reading a variety of styles of Medieval Latin;
- 4) Explore the development of handwriting from Roman capitals to later hands, from inscriptions to manuscripts;
- 5) Develop lessons for teaching in a high school classroom.

Prerequisites: Latin 201 (Intermediate I) or equivalent.

Dates Offered: Summer 2015, for six weeks, June 8-July 13, as an online course.

Elza C. Tiner, Professor of Latin & English, teaches in the Modern and Classical Languages and English Departments at Lynchburg College, where she has been developing the General Education and Minor programs in Latin since 2007. She received her M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in Medieval Studies from the University of Toronto and the Licentiate degree in Mediaeval Studies from the Pontifical Institute of Mediaeval Studies, Toronto, where she has also been a Visiting Fellow during Summers 2012-2014. In 2014 she received the [Shirley E. Rosser Award for Excellence in Teaching](#) at Lynchburg College.
