What A Busy Spring!



At this year's Spring Meeting, we heard three fabulous talks. Dr. Susann Lusnia (Tulane University) opened our eyes to the use of violence in Roman art, seen to the left. She was followed by Cygnet Steer (Virginia Tech /Radford), who drew copious parallels between the pre-Christian and Christian Roman calendars, explaining possibilities for these parallels. Finally, Dr. Angela Pitts (University of Mary Washington) drew our attention to the use, and lack, of sound in the Iliad.

Mark Keith also passed the gavel to Dr. Liane Houghtalin (University of Mary Washington), beginning her two-year presidency. Patty Lister (TJHSST) was chosen to fill the Vice President vacancy. Patty Lister is honored and excited to serve the CAV as Vice President, after several years as the Membership Chair. She has taught Latin at various public schools in Virginia for more than 25 years, the last 10 at Thomas Jefferson High School for Science and Technology. She enjoys traveling, both with her family and with students to see Roman sites all over the Mediterranean. She has been on the Steering and Writing Committee of the National Latin Exam since 2010. Patty especially enjoys working with new teachers, and has co-presented several workshops for beginning teachers at ACL Institutes over the years. She teaches a Latin Methods course at the University of Virginia every other summer – the next one should be in 2019. Rachel Caudill was also announced as the new editor of The CAV News.

The 2018 Jane Harriman Hall Award for Outstanding Service to the CAV was awarded to Linda S. Montross, in part for her tireless work on the National Latin Exam. The 2018 Wayne W. Wray CAV Student Scholarship was awarded to Alicia Lopez of St. Stephen's & St. Agnes School (teacher, Ian Hochberg). The 2018 Lurlene Todd Teacher of the Year was awarded to Susan S. Schearer of Classical Cottage. Finally, the 2018 Angela Lloyd Book Award was given to Amy Peterson of Midlothian High School.

Three CAV Professional Development Grants were given out in the 2017-2018 year. Nora Kelley received one for Salvi Biduum at Claymont; Lori Kissell received one for FLAVA; and Paul Perrot received one for Living Latin in NY.

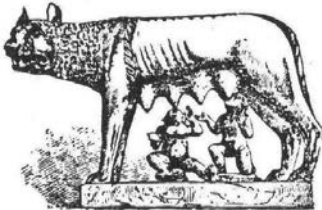
